At iMentor, we are constantly learning, refining, and growing through research, evaluation, and reflection. We are measuring long-term outcomes as well as the short-term outcomes that students and mentors in our program are achieving each year.


iMentor utilizes rigorous comparisons to contextualize our outcomes. Our comparisons for college enrollment and completion use National Student Clearinghouse data focused on high schools in which at least 50 percent of students qualify for free or reduced lunch and at least 40 percent of students are Black or Hispanic.



College Outcomes


iMentor is tracking the long-term college outcomes* of nearly 12,000 students nationally since 2009.

Our students continue to outperform the best comparable peer groups in college enrollment and completion, even though Black, Latinx, and Native American communities have been most affected by the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic.

College Aspirations



95% of iMentor students aspire to go to college...

...but only 67% believed they would meet that goal.

Navigating the College Process

With the support of mentors, students work toward college success and plan to pursue their career aspirations.



When there was a deadline of October 31, my mentor, Sam, messaged me the night of and the night before.

She said, "If you need anything, I'm always a text away, a call away. I'm not busy right now. You can message me. I'll get in touch with you later to see how things are going." And I just thought, 'Wow, she's giving me a bunch of her time.' That was really cool.
